Getting Back To Mass

Thank God that we have reached this day when we can return to public Masses once more. We welcome you back to Mass. Please note that the following practices will be in place in order to keep everyone safe and well.

- ❖ Each church will have sanitizer dispensers and appropriate signage in place.
- ❖ There will be no Holy Water in the fonts.
- ❖ All collections will take place in the porch before or after Mass
- ❖ You will collect your own leaflet on the way into Mass and bring it with you at the end of Mass.
- ❖ People must keep physically distant from each other - this means that you will most likely not be able to sit in your normal seat.
- ❖ The front seats will be filled first.
- ❖ Family groups may stay together
- ❖ There will be no sign of peace
- ❖ Ushers will help people as enter the church, as they go forward for Communion and as they leave the church.
- ❖ It is recommended that everyone receive Holy Communion on the hand.
- ❖ There will be a limit on the number of people that can be present in the church at any one time.
- ❖ Priests and Eucharistic ministers will wash their hands immediately before Mass. They will sanitize them immediately before distributing Communion and will wash and will sanitize them again afterwards. They will wear face-masks during the distribution of Communion to protect those receiving Communion.
