Face Coverings in Body of Church

During the past week the leaders of all the Christian churches in Ireland issued a joint statement strongly recommending that from this Sun. 30 August 2020 people attending Mass or other liturgies in the church should wear face-coverings. Some people are exempted from wearing face coverings. However, we encourage you, if at all possible, that you do wear a face-covering during Mass.

Face Coverings in Sanctuary of Church

It may not be possible for those who are in the sanctuary area such as readers and priests to wear masks. However, they should at all times continue to maintain at least two metre physical distancing from one another, and four metre physical distancing from the front row of the congregation. Priests and Eucharistic Ministers must wear masks when distributing Holy Communion
